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Introduction

Thank you for purchasing "The Walking Running Marching Easter." This play may be utilized by various-sized preschools and church groups. You are highly encouraged to use your imagination to adapt this Easter play to fit the needs of your children and/or school.

There are five songs that your children will practice and learn. It is recommended that all the children who will be performing sing each of the songs together. However, if you are directing a large school or children's ministry, you may wish to have individual classes learn and sing only individual songs. Because this play celebrates body movement, it is also highly recommended that you create and teach hand and body motions for each of the songs that are appropriate for the age of the children performing the play.

"The Walking Running Marching Easter" is written in such a way that the story of Easter is told by a narrator. This narrator may be a school director or children's ministry director, a teacher, or another adult. The narration may also be broken into parts and read by several different people.

As a part of the play, there is an option for having children act out the parts. Roles include Mary Magdalene and the other Mary, an angel, guards, Peter and John, the two men on the road to Emmaus, a group of disciples, and Jesus. It is recommended that you create Bible-time costumes and a colorful set in order to fit with the overall theme of the play. Ideally, the set will have a cave or tomb (which can be made out of drop cloths spray-painted splotchy gray and brown) as well as a large stone (which can be made, for instance, out of a sheet of plywood cut in a large circle and also painted gray).

Have fun! Use your imagination! And may God bless your efforts as you tell the important story of Jesus' resurrection.
